The urgency of these items is that on March 13, 2020, the Governor of the State of Texas declared a state of disaster and the President of the United States of America declared a national emergency in relation to COVID-19. On March 14, the President of the United States held an additional press conference relating to COVID-19, and on March 15, 2020, the CDC issued additional guidance in relation to the same. On March 16, 2020, the Mayor of the City of Laredo issued a local emergency declaration. Due to the rapidly evolving nature of the disease and emerging federal and state guidance, it is necessary that the City Council of Laredo consider and take action on emergency ordinances.

# AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LAREDO, TEXAS EXTENDING A DISASTER DECLARATION DUE TO A PUBLIC HEALTH EMEGENCY

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAREDO:

**WHEREAS**, on March 13, 2020, the Governor of the State of Texas declared a state of disaster and the President of the United States of America declared a national emergency in relation to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020 the Mayor signed a Local Emergency Declaration and requested the aid of the state Government pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 418.108; and

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization Director General urged aggressive preparedness and activation of emergency plans to aggressively change the trajectory of this pandemic; and

WHEREAS, §418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code provides that a local state of disaster may not be continued for a period in excess of seven days without the consent of the governing body of the political subdivision; and

WHEREAS, City Charter Section 2.11 allows for the City Council to adopt an emergency ordinance to meet a public emergency affecting, life, health, property or the public peace; and

WHEREAS, the condition necessitating declaration of a state of disaster continues to exist.

### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF LAREDO, TEXAS:

- 1. That the state of disaster proclaimed for the City of Laredo by the Mayor on March 16, 2020 shall continue for thirty (30) days unless re-enacted in accordance with City Charter Section 2.11 or until terminated by order of the City Council, whichever is sooner.
- 2. This ordinance is adopted as an emergency measure with the unanimous vote of the City Council Representatives present and the consent of the Mayor and pursuant to City Charter section 2.11 and shall become effective on the 17th day of March, 2020.
