

Statement re: The Millennium Tower Association Meets DBI's 3pm Deadline

On September 12, 2018, at 12:00 p.m., The Millennium Tower Association (MTA) received a demand for several items from the Department of Building Inspection (DBI). One item was to install "an overhead protection system...at the entire perimeter of both the 58-story tower and the 12-story structure" by today at 3:00 p.m. The MTA immediately contacted scaffolding companies and obtained bids for this demand.

Two engineers from the DBI visiting MTA Management this morning verbally agreed that erecting this system on Fremont and Beale Street, in addition to the system already in place on Mission Street, will be sufficient until the MTA can provide an expert report confirming that the 12-story structure is not in need of this system.

The overhead protection system installation will begin this afternoon at 3:00 p.m. and continue at 4:00 a.m. Friday morning.

The MTA takes the DBI demands very seriously and is grateful for the DBI's visit to the Association today, and is hopeful that the threat to yellow tag the building tomorrow will be reconsidered.

MTA also provided a timely response today to all demands outlined by the DBI in their September 12^{th} letter.
